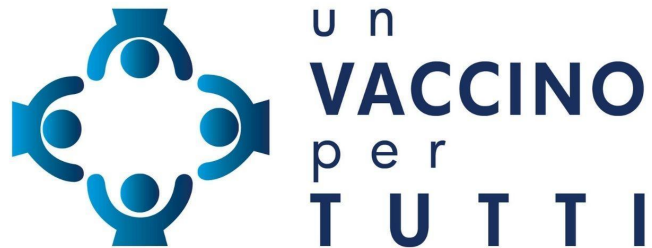

RESEARCH & EDUCATION

We evaluate the impact of our action by collecting and analyzing quantitative and qualitative data, and by conducting operational research to guide and improve strategies and methods of intervention.

The formal collaboration with the **University of Brescia**, the **University of Verona** and the **ISS - Istituto Superiore di Sanità** is essential to support training activities, operational research in the field, and scientific validation of good care practices.



Health for All!

Promoters: Confindustria Brescia, Cgil, Cisl and Uil provincial governments.

The initiative, launched in September 2021, supports the Covid-19 vaccination campaign in Mozambique, one of the world's poorest countries.

Location: Morrumbene, Massinga, Funhaloro, Homoine, and Panda Districts in the Inhambane Province

Activities:

- purchasing/distribution of **tens of thousands of doses of vaccines, syringes, needles, small incinerators**, etc.
- training nurses and technicians;
- supplying **medical supplies** (saturation meters, cardiac monitors), **rapid swabs, PPE** (masks, gloves, protective suits, sanitizers);
- supporting **fuel costs** for vaccinating the most vulnerable populations in villages;
- providing **freezers, triage tents, and patient isolation tents**;
- providing 1 **ambulance**;
- **supporting mobile health teams** that deliver vaccines to remote villages miles from health centers.

COMMUNITY HEALTH

MMI is committed to strengthening local health systems to improve access to basic health services by taking direct action in remote communities and health centers, with a focus on mothers and children.



MANAGEMENT OF INFECTIOUS DISEASES

MMI works with local health systems to increase HIV, tuberculosis, and malaria awareness, prevention, and treatment, particularly among adolescents and youth.



OVERCOMING CHILD MALNUTRITION

MMI promotes nutrition education, breastfeeding for at least 6 months of a child's life, nutritional support for children aged 6 to 23 months, and treatment of chronic and acute malnutrition.



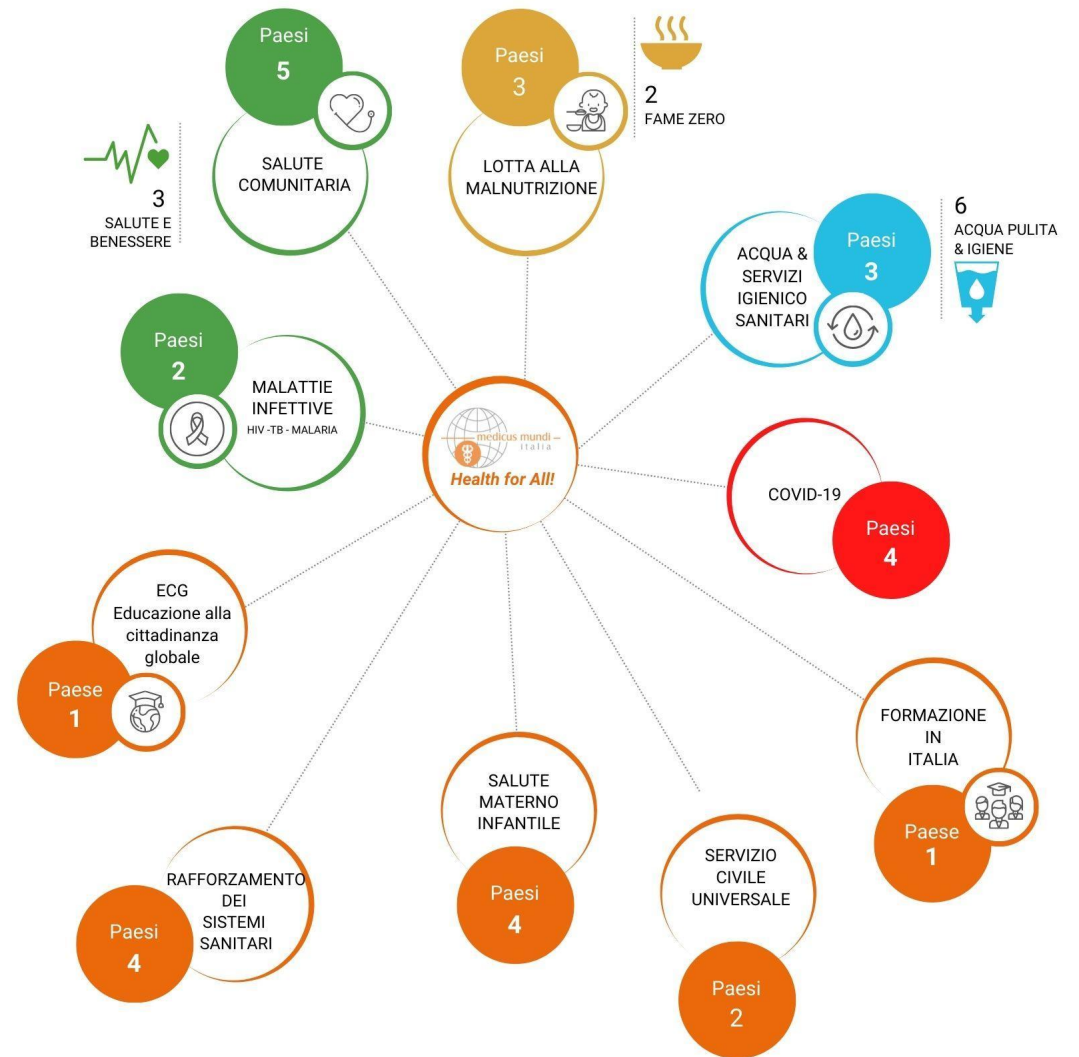
WASH

MMI views access to water, rehabilitation and implementation of drinking water and sanitation facilities, and training of communities on water resource management as critical components of ensuring a better life for all people.



TRAINING

MMI prioritizes the training of social and health workers both abroad and in Italy, particularly through collaboration with the University of Brescia's Clinic of Infectious and Tropical Diseases and other universities and research centers.



COMMUNITY HEALTH

Community health is primary health care, it is presence on the ground, it is the convergence of health services and economic and social responsibilities.

Community health is the practice and spread of the right to health for all, even in remote and vulnerable communities.

Working for community health entails collaborating with local public health authorities to address disparities in service access.

In accordance with SDG 3, MMI's community health programs in Brazil, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Kenya, and Mozambique seek to improve the quality and accessibility of services for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of major diseases that affect the most vulnerable families.

The association's programs aim to include communities in decision-making and reduce hospitalization costs.

MMI's projects support the strengthening of facilities, the provision of medical equipment, public awareness, and the availability and training of medical personnel at various levels (medical treatment, screening, counseling).

INFECTIOUS DISEASES

HIV – TB – MALARIA

MMI collaborates with health districts and sub-counties to strengthen the training and skills of community health and social agents, as well as to ensure services for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of people living with HIV and/or tuberculosis in the most vulnerable and disadvantaged communities in Inhambane Province, Mozambique, and the slums of Nairobi, Kenya.

At the global level, the COVID-19 pandemic has slowed progress toward SDG Goal 3 of combating HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, and malaria.

According to *the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria*, HIV testing decreased by 41% in 2020 and referral services for diagnosis and treatment decreased by 37% compared to 2019.

Despite this, MMI has strengthened its commitment to and collaboration with local partners by maintaining HIV and TB prevention, diagnosis, referral, and treatment services in Mozambique and Kenya and by ensuring support for those who, as a result of COVID-19, have found themselves even more marginalized and deprived of the right to access care. This has been made possible thanks to dedicated project staff and community health and social agents.

MALNUTRITION

According to the FAO, approximately 193 million people worldwide were severely food insecure in 2021, an increase of nearly 40 million from 2020; in 2020, approximately one-third of the world's population (2.37 billion) lacked adequate food access, 320 million more than in 2019. Malnutrition affects 282 million people in Africa, putting us further and further away from the 2030 Zero Hunger goal (SDG1).

MMI is engaged in the fight against malnutrition in Burkina Faso, Burundi, and Mozambique through community-based programs of prevention, screening, intake, and treatment of acute and chronic malnutrition, as well as capacity building of local health systems we collaborate with.

The fight against malnutrition takes the form of activities aimed at women and children: nutrition awareness and education, accompanied by cooking demonstrations and promotion of appropriate diets for mothers and children, promotion of breastfeeding until at least 6 months of a child's life, nutritional support for children aged 6 to 23 months, and treatment of cases of acute malnutrition.

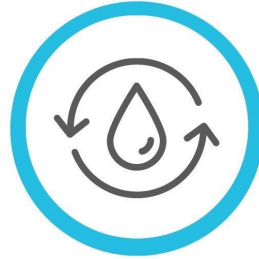


WASH - WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

As stated in Goal 6 of the SDGs, access to safe drinking water and sanitation is a human right and a critical determinant of every community's human, social, health, economic, and environmental development. Ensuring access to water for all means providing every human being with a source of safe water and enough water to live in dignity and perform basic daily activities.

It also entails managing the resource optimally and appropriately, avoiding waste and contamination, by constructing infrastructure for water supply and wastewater management. Furthermore, the availability of water and its proper use help to combat hunger by improving crop and food production.

In each intervention context and across the various public health fields where it operates, MMI carries out activities to: raise awareness of proper water use and hygiene; provide sources of water supply, collection and distribution to underserved communities; rehabilitate toilets facilities in remote health centers; and establish and train community water management committees.

MMI is committed to the placement and training of volunteers in Universal Civil Service in Italy and in the countries of intervention, as part of the FOCSIV- Volontari nel Mondo national project "WHITE HELMETS."

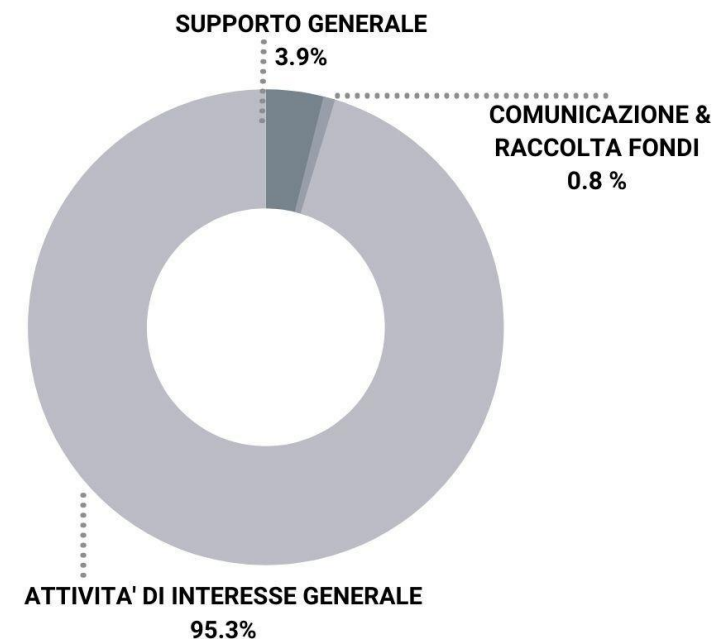
